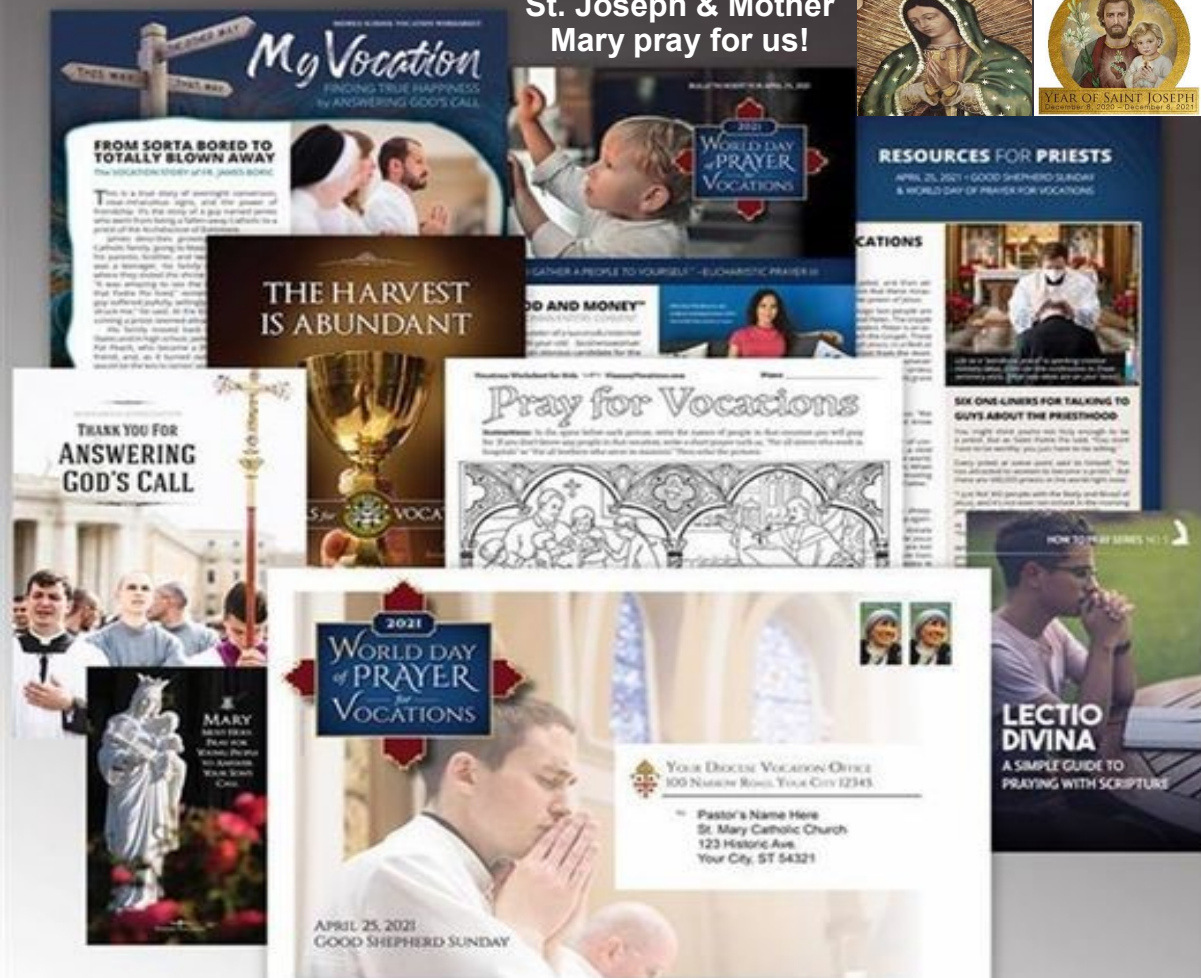

Prayer for more Vocations

O God, Who wish all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of Your truth: send, we beg You, laborers into Your harvest, and grant them grace to speak Your word with all boldness; so that Your word may spread and be glorified, and all nations may know You, the only God, and Him Whom You have sent, Jesus Christ Your Son, Our Lord, Who lives and reigns world without end. Amen.

Oración por más vocaciones

Oh Dios, que desees que todos los hombres se salven y lleguen al conocimiento de tu verdad: te suplicamos que envíes obreros a tu mies, y concédeles la gracia de que hablen tu palabra con todo denuedo; para que tu palabra se difunda y sea glorificada, y todas las naciones te conozcan a ti, el único Dios, ya quien has enviado, Jesucristo tu Hijo, nuestro Señor, que vive y reina por los siglos de los siglos. Amén.

"God calls you to make definitive choices, and He has a plan for each of you: to discover that plan and to respond to your vocation is to move toward personal fulfillment." *Pope Francis*

Reflection: *Jesus is the one who calls, not the priest, nor the bishop or the Pope. It is Jesus who gazes at him with love, who shows him the people, who shows him the needs of the people of God and says, 'if you wish, come help.'*

As Francis expressed in his words, the vocation of a priest, deacon or religious is a response to a unique invitation from Jesus. The word *vocation* itself comes from the Latin word *vocare* which means "to call." Every baptized Christian is called by Jesus to follow Him in a unique way, and those who are called to the priesthood, diaconate, and religious life are called to a unique life of service in the Church. *The Second Vatican Council* stressed that the duty of fostering vocations to the priesthood falls on the whole Christian community, the greatest contribution being made by families that live out their Christian faith. The *Decree on the Training of Priests* describes the family as the "first seminary" since there young men learn faith, charity and piety. Faithful Christian families where children experience God's love are fertile ground for vocations to the priesthood. Of course parishes, priests and bishops do much to encourage vocations to the priesthood, yet discipleship begins at home. Jesus never ceases to call priests, deacons and religious for His Church. Could he be calling you?

Reflexion: Como expresó Francisco en sus palabras, la vocación de sacerdote, diácono o religioso es una respuesta a una invitación única de Jesús. La palabra vocación en sí proviene de la palabra latina *vocare* que significa "llamar". Cada cristiano bautizado es llamado por Jesús a seguirlo de una manera única, y aquellos que son llamados al sacerdocio, al diaconado y a la vida religiosa están llamados a una vida de servicio única en la Iglesia. El Concilio Vaticano II destacó que el deber de fomentar las vocaciones al sacerdocio recae en toda la comunidad cristiana, siendo la mayor contribución la de las familias que viven su fe cristiana. El Decreto sobre la formación de los sacerdotes describe a la familia como el "primer seminario", ya que allí los jóvenes aprenden la fe, la caridad y la piedad. Las familias cristianas fieles donde los niños experimentan el amor de Dios son terreno fértil para las vocaciones sacerdotales. Por supuesto, las parroquias, sacerdotes y obispos hacen mucho para fomentar las vocaciones al sacerdocio, pero el discipulado comienza en casa. Jesús nunca deja de llamar sacerdotes, diáconos y religiosos para su Iglesia. ¿Podría estar llamándote?

FEAST OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD REFLECTION / REFLEXION



"There is a time for everything, a time to laugh and time to mourn, a time to gather and a time to scatter".... Ecclesiastes

The feast of the Lord's Ascension that we celebrate

today literally means a 'time for departure'. As Jesus came, was born, lived, preached and healed, spread the word of God in Action, he suffered and died, rose again, today we remember his day (time) of departure. But unlike many departures that are typically sad and unhappy, this time of departure is NOT SAD at all. It is a departure that MUST HAPPEN according to God's plan, and there is a BONUS in Jesus' departing- for in RETURN, God now TRUSTS the disciples with his mission, to continue the work of Jesus on earth. It is a time of *passing on the baton* (if you will). It is moment and time for a new start and moment of new hope and therefore, Joy. The Disciples are *trusted* by God. God takes the disciples (us) SERIOUSLY, to entrust us (disciples) with his mission.

We, all in our daily lives, do not just throw around our trust. We think twice about whom to give our trust. Jesus does the same and does not hesitate to give us this responsibility. And, of course, he promises his presence in the person of the Holy Spirit, who will walk and journey with us.

"Hay un tiempo para todo, un tiempo para reír y un tiempo para llorar, un tiempo para reunirse y un tiempo para esparcirse". Ecles.

La fiesta de la Ascensión del Señor que celebramos hoy significa literalmente "hora de partida". Cuando Jesús vino, nació, vivió, predicó y sanó, difundió la palabra de Dios en Acción, sufrió y murió, resucitó, hoy recordamos su día (hora) de partida.

Pero a diferencia de muchas salidas que suelen ser tristes e infelices, esta hora de salida NO ES TRISTE en absoluto. Es una partida que DEBE SUCEDER de acuerdo con el plan de Dios, y hay una BONIFICACIÓN en la partida de Jesús, porque en el REGRESO, Dios ahora CONFIANZA en los discípulos con su misión, para continuar la obra de Jesús en la tierra. Es el momento de pasar el testigo (por así decirlo). Es el momento y el momento de un nuevo comienzo y un momento de nueva esperanza y, por tanto, de Alegría. Dios confía en los discípulos. Dios toma en serio a los discípulos (nosotros), para confiarnos (discípulos) su misión.

Nosotros, todos en nuestra vida diaria, no solo derrochamos nuestra confianza. Pensamos dos veces en quién confiar. Jesús hace lo mismo y no duda en darnos esta responsabilidad. Y, por supuesto, promete su presencia en la persona del Espíritu Santo, que caminará y viajará con nosotros.

SAINT'S LIFE CORNER / RINCÓN DE LA VIDA DE SAN

Saint Bernardine of Siena. In 1408 St. Vincent Ferrer once suddenly interrupted his sermon to declare that there was among his hearers a young Franciscan who would be one day a greater preacher than himself, and would be set before him in honor by the Church. This unknown friar was Bernardine. Of noble birth, he had spent his youth in works of mercy, and had then entered



religion. Owing to a defective utterance, his success as a preacher at first seemed doubtful, but, by the prayers of Our Lady, this obstacle was miraculously removed, and Bernardine began an apostolate which lasted thirty-eight years. By his burning words and by the power of the Holy Name of Jesus, which he displayed on a tablet at the end of his sermons, he obtained miraculous conversions, and reformed the greater part of Italy. But this success had to be exalted by the cross. The Saint was denounced as a heretic and his devotion as idolatrous. After many trials he lived to see his innocence proved, and a lasting memorial of his work established in a Church. The Feast of the Holy Name commemorates at once his sufferings and his triumph. He died on Ascension Eve, 1444, while his brethren were chanting the antiphon, "Father, I have manifested Thy Name to men."

St. Bernardine, when a youth, undertook the charge of a holy old woman, a relation of his, who had been left destitute. She was blind and bedridden, and during her long illness could only utter the Holy Name. The Saint watched over her till she died, and thus learned the devotion of his life.

San Bernardo de Siena. En 1408 San Vicente Ferrer interrumpió repentinamente una vez su sermón para declarar que había entre sus oyentes un joven franciscano que algún día sería un predicador más grande que él, y que la Iglesia le honraría. Este fraile desconocido era Bernardo. De noble cuna, había pasado su juventud en obras de misericordia, y luego había entrado religión. Debido a una pronunciación defectuosa, su éxito como El predicador al principio parecía dudar, pero, por las oraciones de Nuestra Señora, este obstáculo fue quitado milagrosamente, y Bernardo comenzó un apostolado que duró treinta y ocho años. Por sus ardientes palabras y por el poder del Santo Nombre de Jesús, que mostró en una tableta al final de sus sermones, obtuvo milagrosos conversiones, y reformó la mayor parte de Italia. Pero esto el éxito tenía que ser exaltado por la cruz. El Santo fue denunciado como hereje y su devoción como idólatra. Después de muchas pruebas, vivió para ver demostrada su inocencia y establecer un recuerdo duradero de su obra en una Iglesia. La fiesta del santo nombre conmemora a la vez sus sufrimientos y su triunfo. Murió en la víspera de la Ascensión de 1444, mientras sus hermanos cantaban el antifona, "Padre, he manifestado Tu Nombre a los hombres". San Bernardo, siendo joven, asumió el cargo de una santa anciana, pariente suya, que había quedado desamparada. Estaba ciega y postrada en cama, y durante su larga enfermedad solo pudo pronunciar el Santo Nombre. El Santo la cuidó hasta que murió, y así aprendió la devoción de su vida.
